- Welcome

- Old Business
  - Minutes from March meeting

- NJLA Honors & Awards nominations
  - IF award nominating the two educators from Washington Township. Everyone in attendance is in agreement.
- NJLA Conference
  - Table

- Regional Response Team

- Garden State Equity and HiTOPS
