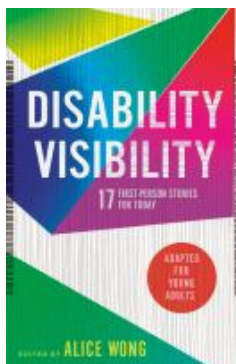


Title: Crazy Horse and Custer: Born Enemies
