- State Library
 - NJSL Report for D&O Section Meeting, April 28, 2022

 - From the State Librarian:
 - We've received our FY 2022 LSTA allotment from IMLS; funds are available to use through September 2023. We've received just over \$4.3 million. Of that, we'll be making a portion available to libraries through a competitive grant process, in addition to supporting Jersey Clicks, Jersey Cat and Jersey Connect.

- We will also be running a Tischler grant opportunity exclusively for small libraries later this spring. More to come on those in the coming weeks.
- We're in the early stages of working with the NJ Office of Innovation, NJLA and LLNJ on a statewide back-to-the-library campaign to coincide with National Library Card Sign Up Month in September. Be on the lookout for more information. Our intent is to provide you with helpful marketing tools to get people back in your library.
- I hope you'll join us at the annual NJLA conference on June 2 for a special Thursday session we're hosting that features R. David Lankes. Dr. Lankes' work is familiar to many of us, plus he's a New Jersey native who teaches in the library school at the University of Texas-Austin. His talk promises to be either provocative, or inspiring, or perhaps both! And on Friday, June 3, please join NJSL staff for a continental breakfast. We'd love the chance to say hello in person after such a long hiatus.
- A new LSTA five-year plan (2023-2027) is being developed. Thank you to everyone who spoke with our consultant and provided feedback. Next up, a team from the State Library will be working with the consultant to develop goals and outcomes for the plan that align with the Library Services and Technology Act priorities.

A library school, department of education in a college or university or a children's library system may be considered. The lecture is administered by ALSC.

He has illustrated more than 30 picture books and is the recipient of multiple awards, including numerous Coretta Scott King illustrator awards and honors, four Caldecott honors, and the Ezra Jack Keats New Illustrator Award.
