#### SYNC: Free Audiobooks for Teens 13+ (Started April 29th)

As audiobook popularity grows AudioFile Magazine encourages teen listening with a special summer program that provides participants two FREE audiobook titles per week starting April 29, 2021. Teens, librarians, club leaders, and educators must register for SYNC and download OverDrive's Sora app to their device of choice. The participants then use the app to borrow titles each week (titles roll over at midnight Eastern Time each Thursday). The first two titles are Come on In, edited by Adi Alsaid and Disappeared (Illegal 2) by Francisco X. Stork.

Included titles will be available to borrow for one week only but remain accessible to the registered user indefinitely within Sora. SYNC makes two thematically paired audiobooks available for checkout every week, at no cost, to every registered listener all summer. In 2021, 28 titles will be accessible through the 14-week-long season.

## **CSLP Updates**

What feedback would you give the artist if these images were submitted? What sticks out or resonates with you? What might a child take away from these images? There is no right or wrong answer, we are just hoping to see your thought process in evaluating the artwork and providing thoughtful and constructive feedback.

ALA announces \$125M emergency fund for libraries impacted by COVID-19 The American Library Association (ALA) announced it will make available \$1.25M in emergency relief grants to libraries that have experienced substantial economic hardship due to the coronavirus pandemic. The ALA COVID Library Relief Fund invites public, school, academic, and tribal libraries across the United States and US Territories to apply for grants of \$30,000 to \$50,000. These funds are intended to bolster library operations and services including broadening technology access, developing collections, providing digital instruction, staffing, and expanding outreach, as well as maintaining and amplifying existing service strategies or adding new ones to extend impact through the end of 2021. Grant applications are accepted online through May 20, 2021. Additional information and award guidelines are available on the grant application site.
