<u>The 90-Second Newbery Award Virtual Film Festival, April 30, 2022 at 3 PM – NJ Youth Have Submitted Entries</u>

The 90-Second Newbery Film Festival is an annual video contest in which kid filmmakers create short movies that tell the entire stories of Newbery-winning books in about 90 seconds (adults can help). These movies often have a creative twist—think *Charlotte's Web* in the style of a horror movie, or *Ramona and Her Father* reimagined as a musical, or *Bridge to Terabithia* done in stop-motion animation!

Since 2011, the 90-Second Newbery has shown the best kid-made movies in annual events across the country, at screenings attended by hundreds in New York City, San Francisco, Chicago, Boston, and a dozen other cities—and now including New Jersey! These free events are full-scale stage shows with skits and commentary and music that honors the kids' movies, hosted by film festival founder James Kennedy (author of *The Order of Odd-Fish*) and other award-winning and bestselling authors.

This year, because of Covid, most screenings will be online. New Jersey's first 90-Second Newbery screening, featuring the best movies made by kids from New Jersey and around the country, will be April 30, 2022 at 3 pm EST, and you can find it here:

<u>Apply Now: Archives, History & Heritage Advanced Internship Program through</u> <u>the Library of Congress</u>

The Library of Congress is seeking applicants for its next <u>Archives, History and Heritage</u> <u>Advanced Internship Program</u>, which will run from Sept. 12 to Nov. 18, 2022. This 10-week <u>onsite</u> and <u>remote</u> paid internship is open to undergraduate juniors and seniors, graduate and doctoral students interested in learning and conducting research at the largest library in the world. Deadline to apply is April 25.

The internship program gives the next generation of diverse archivists and knowledge workers invaluable opportunities to analyze, organize and interpret collections or programs that help share an inclusive story of the American experience. Internships and projects will heighten visibility and promote accessibility for Library resources that more fully represent the rich cultural and creative heritage of the United States. The program targets Black, Indigenous and communities of color historically underrepresented in the United States and in the Library's collections.
