## **Grants from Other Organizations**

ALA Annual Grant Opportunities – Both Due Feb. 1, 2023

- The <u>Libraries Transform Communities Engagement Grant</u> will provide two libraries with \$2,000 to expand their community engagement efforts.
- The <u>Peggy Barber Tribute Grant</u> aims to help ease library budget challenges by awarding three libraries \$2,500 to support a proposed program, program series, or programming effort.

## Penguin Random House Young Readers Group Award – Deadline Dec. 31, 2022

This award, made possible by an annual gift from Penguin Young Readers Group and Random House Children's Books, provides a \$600 stipend to up to four children's librarians to attend their first ALA Annual Conference. Each applicant will be judged on the following:

Involvement in ALSC, as well as any other professional or educational association of which the applicant was a member, chair, etc. New programs or innovations started by the applicants at the library in which they work, Library experience.

## Requirements

Applicants must:

Be personal members of ALSC as well as ALA; organizational members are not eligible Work directly with children in elementary, middle schools or public libraries Have less than ten years, but more than one year, of experience as a children's librarian by the opening of the Annual Conference. No previous attendance at an in-person ALA Annual Conference.
