- Inclusive Internship Initiative Application Open
- The Public Library Association's Inclusive Internship Initiative offers paid, summer-long internships to high school students at their local public library. PLA will fund library internships this summer for 50 high school juniors and seniors from diverse populations. Participating host libraries must assign a staff person to serve as a lead mentor, recruit and hire an intern, and be able to accept a \$3,500 stipend, among other requirements. The <a href="mailto:application">application</a> to host an intern over summer 2020 is now open and will close on Feb. 3, 2020.

## ■ Will Eisner Graphic Novel Grant Application Open

■ Applications are open for the 2020 Will Eisner Graphic Novel Grants for Libraries. Three grants will be awarded: two recipients will receive the Will Eisner Graphic Novel Growth Grant, which provides support to libraries that would like to expand their existing graphic novel services and programs, and one recipient will receive the Will Eisner Graphic Novel Innovation Grant, which provides support to a library for the initiation of a graphic novel service or program. Each winning library will receive a grant award of \$4,000 to support initiatives that align with the objective of the Will Eisner Graphic Novel Grants for Libraries. Applications are due February 9, 2020.

## ■ Mini Grants for Digital Skills Programs Application Open

■ The American Library Association is accepting applications for mini-grants for digital skills programs. School, tribal, public, and academic libraries are eligible for \$700 mini-grants to design and implement programs using Google's Applied Digital Skills resources. Up to 290 eligible libraries will be selected to deliver at least 4 sessions throughout the programming they develop (e.g., drop in, multiple sessions, a spring break camp, or weekend workshop) that prepares learners of all ages to use technology tools. The application is due Feb. 14, 2020.

## ■ Dollar General Literacy Foundation Application Open

■ The application process is open for grant funding from the Dollar General Literacy Foundation. Applications for their <u>Family Literacy</u> and <u>Summer Reading</u> <u>grant</u> opportunities are due on Feb. 20, 2020.

#### ■ Game On! Grant Application Open

■ The American Library Association Games and Gaming Round Table has unveiled a new annual grant program to enable libraries to develop gaming programs or collections for their communities. Through the new Game On! grants, \$500 will be awarded, either as one grant of \$500 or two grants of \$250. ALA members currently employed at a public, school, academic, or special library in the US or Canada are eligible to apply. Libraries must illustrate a plan

for a sustainable gaming program created with the funds as well as financial need and institutional support for the program. The online <u>application</u> is open now through March 1. Learn more here.

- Apply for the 2020 Miss Rumphius Award!: Deadline to Apply is Monday, February 17, 2020
- The New Jersey Center for the Book is seeking nominations for its 2020 Miss Rumphius Award.
- Based on the title character of Barbara Cooney's book, *Miss Rumphius*, winner of the National Book Award in 1983, this Award honors public librarians, school media specialists, and educators who are stellar in spreading ideas about literacy.
- The deadline for submitting nominations is Monday, February 17, 2020. The nominee must be employed in New Jersey as a professional librarian, library staff member, certified educator, or teacher assistant, and must have developed creative activities to enhance learning and literacy. The activity should be collaborative, innovative, and able to be replicated by other librarians and educators. The nominee must be willing to help produce her or his program for other classrooms and/or libraries. A monetary amount of \$200.00 and a NJCFB Miss Rumphius Award certificate will be presented to the recipient in 2020.
- The nomination shall include the full name of the nominee and the place of employment; shall describe the activity or program in complete detail; shall describe the setting in which it takes place; shall indicate the collaborative aspects; shall indicate the innovative aspects of the program or activity and indicate how it can be replicated; shall include the full name and title of the nominator with address, email, phone number and fax number; shall include a letter of support from an administrator, from a former or current student, from a client or patron, or from a member of the staff.
